ELEMENTARY STUDENTS VISIT DAVIS CABIN

The Davis Cabin is located on Shawan Falls Drive by the Indian Falls parking lot. Visitors of the falls or post office often pass the cabin but do not know about the building's history or get to look inside. For the past year, Dublin Schools gifted education specialist and Society Trustee, Katie Guehl, spearheaded an initiative to furnish the Davis Cabin and create a living history exhibit for elementary students. And, on May 5 and 6, the Society opened Davis Cabin to students from Wright and Thomas elementaries who spend the day experiencing life in the 1800s. The event was such a success that the Society plans to find additional times throughout the year for both students and adults to visit the cabin and learn about pioneer life.



ESL STUDENTS TOUR HISTORIC DUBLIN



On April 28, the Society hosted 20 English as a second language students along with their teachers on a walking tour of the Dublin Historic District offering insight into Dublin's settlement and development of the past 210 years. Stops along the way included Dublin Spring Park, Dublin's former firehouse, the Dublin Community Church, the Grounds of Remembrance, Indian Run gorge, S. Riverview St, and S. High St.

DUBLIN SCIOTO HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS STUDY LOUISA MAY ALCOTT

Dublin Scioto's AP Studies class does a lot of ambitious projects, but none quite like the Louisa May Alcott Immersive Experience. Sophomore students in Mr. Witt's and Mrs. D'Arcangelo's class were tasked with transforming the lobby of their school's theater into 1800's Concord, Massachusetts based on the life of the famous author of the book Little Women by Louisa May Alcott. After a staggering two months of researching her life, table groups teamed up and tasked with transforming the normal lobby into different aspects of her life from the culture of the time period, her childhood, and her legacy. The experience was the culmination of four months of work and included collaboration with the Dublin Historical Society (who donated era specific and authentic artifacts such as a bonnet and a Civil War era uniform and letters), League of Women Voters (who aided key parts of research), and the Dublin Education Foundation (which provided contributions for research and construction). Students also developed a website which will be shared with and utilized by local schools interested in learning more about Louisa May Alcott and the time period in history.
